FEEDING

COW KITCHEN COWS EAT ABOUT **100** POUNDS OF NUTRIENT-RICH FOODS AND DRINK UP TO 50 GALLONS OF WATER (ABOUT A BATHTUB FULL) EACH DAY.



MILKING CENTER

MILKIN' IT COWS NEED TO BE **MILKED** 2-3 TIMES PER DAY—EVEN ON WEEKENDS AND HOLIDAYS.



WASTE STORAGE

THE SCOOP ON POOP COW MANURE, OR POOP, IS **RECYCLED** AS FERTILIZER FOR CROPS, DRIED FOR BEDDING AND CAN EVEN CREATE ELECTRICITY FOR YOUR HOME.



STORING MILK

KEEPIN' IT COOL MILK MUST BE COOLED AND KEPT **CHILLED** UNTIL IT LEAVES THE FARM ON A REFRIGERATED TANKER TRUCK TO MAKE DELICIOUS AND NUTRITIOUS DAIRY PRODUCTS.



CALF AREA

NURSERY CALVES (BABIES) LIVE IN A SPECIAL AREA WHERE THEY CAN BE WATCHED CLOSELY AND FED A **BALANCED** DIET THAT WILL HELP THEM GROW.



MATERNITY AREA

EXPECTING MAMAS COWS WHO ARE READY TO HAVE A CALF (BABY) RECEIVE SPECIAL CARE IN THIS AREA BEFORE, DURING AND AFTER THEY **GIVE BIRTH**.



GENERAL HOUSING

HOME SWEET HOME COWS ARE KEPT **COMFORTABLE** WITH CLEAN BEDDING, FRESH WATER AND ARE FED A WELL-BALANCED DIET.
